CAME NEAR LYNCHING TEED.

HUSBANDS WHOSE HOMES IMPOSTER! HAD WRECKED TOLD EXPERIENCES THAT WORKED MASS MEET-ING AT NORMAL PARK INTO A FRENZY.

It was just touch and go last night whether the residents of Normal Park who attended a mass meeting in Thorncon hall to denounce "Koresh" Teed would not rise in a body, demolish the flats, roll the angels, cherubims, and seraphims in the mud, and tar and "lights," and other directors of the alleged harem. Public feeling was at fever heat, and one more red hot call to preserve the sanctity of family ties! or the direct invitation of a leader would have brought matters to an immediate issue.

By 8 o'clock the hall was packed to the doors with a representative attendance of the best manhood of the district and a dozen women stood at the entrances eagerly listening to the speeches and resolutions. At least four hundred persons were in the hall. W. C.
