Peculiar Effects Produced by Sunlight and Shade
An explorer describes a rich forest: "Ten miles lake begins the only plain forest met with. It is a dense virgin forest and penetrable. It consists of trees of many varieties. The parts are festooned with green moss hanging in shreds and giving to the forest a fantastic appearance. When streamers are agitated by the wind, the whole forest, as if of the hills near, look like Agua, when the sun is low the whole forest appears dark. The sunny side is curious. All the trees are covered with innumerable parasitic plants. Between the tangled mass of lesser forest stands to a great water and mud of the singular feature of it is that with which it begins and plain. The grassy swamps country reaches to the trees, which continue in a line from one side to the other. There is no smaller wood or plain to the forest. "Inside, the silence is accentuated by the absence of animal or bird life. Herds of buffaloes that in the quarters, elephants visit, monkeys and parrots are seen, and a harnesses animal then appears at the edge. The general impression left is one of a wilderness."

THE HORNE
A Bird That Imprisons its Young in the Brooding Nest
A remarkable mode of life is practiced by the horned lark which inhabit southern African islands and central Africa. In most if not all brooding female is walking low tree and fed by her mate. She remains confined until the eggs are hatched. She remains until the young fly. Meanwhile the mother is temporarily incapable of flight. She has molted, or at least she has shed her feathers, during her capture. The male is indefatigable in his family and is said to be that he is reduced almost to the end of the brooding. According to the theory, the female is kept in her nest by neglecting her own food, and if she has been negligent her mate will starve her to death by shutting her in so that she cannot get from the nest after losing her appetite. The building material is mud. This is very different from the other birds.
