MODERN CHRISTIANITY CRITICISED. Mrs. Lee Assails Church Doctrine at the People's Debating Club. Mrs. Julia Lee delivered alecture before the People's Debating club at No. 116 Fifth av-enue last night. In a long address she made a comparison between the religion of today and that established by Jesus Christ from Nazareth. She declared that the doctrine of Christ as taught by Christ dif-fered materially in many points from the doctrines of Christian churches.
