Old Santa Visited the Homes of Both Rich and Poor.

ALL GENEROUSLY REMEMBERED

Churches Crowded; and Worshipers Made Glad by Christmas Greens and Beautiful Music—Herald's Christmas Gift Mission and Department of Charities' Work More Successful Than Ever.

In spite of the fact that the weather could not have been more unpleasant, there was an abundance of Christmas spirit abroad yesterday.

The Roman (Catholic, Episcopal and Lutheran churches were crowded at the morning services—the latter more particularly at the last mass held at 10:30 o'clock.

The Rescue mission, according to its custom, kept open house yesterday and fed a large number of men and women and children between the hours of 10 o'clock and 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

The Herald Christmas gift mission wagons finished their work Thursday afternoon. Every orphan asylum in the city was remembered and a large box full of dainty trinkets, handkerchiefs, books, pictures, etc., was taken to the Old Ladies' home.

Christmas trees either have been or will be held in the Onondaga County and St. Vincent's orphan asylums, the House of Providence and St. Mary's and with others received, will be distributed.

More than seventy families were supplied by the Department of Charities through Herald readers with Christmas dinners, clothing, toys for the children and in many cases with provisions as well.

There are some grateful hearts among the poor people of Syracuse today, said one of the inspectors of the Department of Charities this morning.
