HAS WOMEN EXPOUNDING HIS VIEWS.

Dr. Teed, the "Messiah" of Washington Heights, Strikes a New Idea,

Dr. Cyrus R. Teed, who alleges he is a second Christ, has instituted a new order of things to gather "angels" into his "heaven" out at Washington Heights. Under the title of "Woman's Mission," a number of women from the "heaven" are being sent out, wherever they can obtain a hearing to expound their faith and sing the praises of their "master," the doctor. Englewood is the lat-est locality selected for conversion to the Through Mrs. A. Miller, No. 6801 faith. Wentworth avenue, the names of the women of Englewood prominent in clubs and organizations were obtained. To these were sent circulars of the first lecture which was given yestorday at Mrs. Miller's, Only ten women faced the speaker, Mrs. L. S. Boomer, when she rose to speak. These were mostly from the "heaven," together with Mrs. Miller and her mother. Mrs. Boomer says we live inside a hollow sphere instead of on the outside of a globe; that astronomers are entirely mistaken about there being other worlds beside this; that stars are only disembodied spirits, and they only appear to be large bodies because telescopes deceive the eye by magnifying objects. She says death never delivers man into anything but continuous death; that matter and spirit are interdependent, and that heaven is not beyond, but right here on any place Teed is that Ďr. Cyrus earth : the perfect type of heaven, a man of perfect mind. Every seventh division of time is ushered in by a personal Messiah, according to Mrs. Boomer. And such an epoch, with Mr. Teed as that Messiah, is now about to occur. Of twenty-five children at the "heaven," she said, there had been only two deaths in two years. The children are all reared together as brothers and sisters. having no parents which they rec. ognize. At the close of her remarks Mrs. Boomer, introduced "Sister Victoria Gracia." She had just returned from the colony which the community has started in Fiorida. One of the chief needs of society, it was explained, was money to transport the number of people who applied to the society for aid. Those who go into the colony receive no pay except a check which shows the amount of work a man has performed. It is the purpose of the "master" to establish couitable exchange bureaus in every city in the world.
